



Record of Discussion of the Meeting to review the preparedness measures with the Chief Secretaries of the Heat Wave prone States/UTs held at 1500 hrs, 29th April 2024 in room no. 119, North Block, MHA, New Delhi.

A meeting was held under the Chairmanship of the Union Home Secretary (HS) in Conference Room No. 119, Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), North Block, on 29.04.2024 at 1500 hrs to review the preparedness measures with the Chief Secretaries of the Heat Wave prone States/UTs. List of participants is at Annexure.

2. At the outset, Union HS welcomed the participants and set the agenda for the meeting. He mentioned about the Heat wave advisories issued by respective Central Ministries and NDMA and the review meetings conducted by NDMA with the various departments of the States/UTs to review the preparedness for Heat Wave during the summer season 2024. He apprised that the Forest fire incidents, which are a frequent phenomenon during summer season will also be discussed during the course of the meeting. Additional Secretary (DM) with the permission of the Chair invited the representatives from National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) and India Meteorological Department (IMD) to make presentations about the preparedness measures taken by them to deal with the Heat wave season 2024.

NDMA

Advisor, Mitigation made a presentation, covering the following:

- i. Heat wave guidelines 2016/ 2019 and other focused advisories of NDMA should be followed by the Heat wave prone States/UTs.
- ii. Several review meetings have been conducted by NDMA with various departments of Heat wave prone States/UTs, with special focus on preparedness for Forest Fires and Hospital Fire Safety.
- iii. He gave a demonstration of the IMD Mausam website, focusing on special Heat Wave bulletins such as on elections, railways, and participants were advised to use the website and download the Mausam app on mobile phones.
- iv. Various IMD bulletins such as Daily Heat wave warnings, 5 days Heat wave forecast, special heat wave warnings twice daily and special bulletin on Heat wave for the ongoing Lok Sabha elections 2024 were explained to the participants.
- v. Forest Fire alert system on Van Agni Geo-portal maintained by Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF&CC) should be followed by Heat wave prone States/UTs.
- vi. Director General, Fire Services has issued three advisories on Hospital safety with special focus on electrical short-circuits due to critical equipments and 24X7 air conditioning in hospitals.
- vii. Election Commission of India had a review meeting on 22nd April 2024 and

has established a Task Force to review impact of heat wave 5 days before every polling phase of the ongoing Lok Sabha elections 2024.

- viii. Several Heat Wave prone States/UTs are carrying out pro-active measures on Heat Wave and Hospital Fire Safety such as Issuing Advisories, conduct of awareness generation campaigns, regular mock drills at all Hospitals and ensuring Hospital Fire Safety Audit in accordance with National Building Code of India.
- ix. Representatives from NDMA, NDRF and MoEF&CC have formed a coordination group to focus on large Forest Fires lasting for more than 5 days.
- x. Preventive measures such as removal of fuel load, strengthening and enhancing the Fire Lines and Firefighting equipments and involvement of Local communities in abatement of Forest Fires were highlighted.
- xi. Feedback surveys should be conducted on Forest Fire awareness campaigns to study the understanding of various age groups.
- xii. Comprehensive and coordinated Heat wave action plan of Uttar Pradesh was showed to the participants.
- xiii. Daily Sea surface temperatures and land surface temperatures are at all time high indicating erratic Weather conditions for 2024.

IMD

Director General, IMD gave a presentation on the Heat Wave season 2024 and IMD's forecasting methodology of Heat Wave. Highlights of the presentation are as follows:

- i. Seasonal forecast bulletins March to May 2024 and April to June 2024, monthly forecast bulletins for March and April 2024, and daily forecast bulletins have been issued by IMD.
- ii. Daily impact-based Heat Wave warning bulletin, Hot weather warning forecast for the next 5 days for the Cities, Districts and Meteorological sub-divisions along with experimental Heat Index involving factors like Wind, Humidity and Night time warm temperatures and also in GIS based conditions, are being issued by them.
- iii. Based on NDMA Guidelines 2019, IMD bulletins gives information on expected impact and preventive measures for the impending disaster.
- ✓iv. IMD forecast of Heat wave for April to June Season 2024 indicates above normal Heat wave days likely over most parts in the plains region of Country. 10 to 20 days of heat wave is expected in different parts against normal of 4 to 8 days.
- v. Most prone areas of increased heat wave may be parts of Gujarat, Madhya Maharashtra, north Karnataka followed by Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, North Chhattisgarh, Odisha and Andhra Pradesh.
- vi. Observed Tmax (Maximum Temperature) in March 2024 was 34-40 degrees

Celsius over South and adjoining Central India and observed Tmax In April 2024 was 34-45 degrees Celsius over south India and many parts of East and Central India.

- vii. Observed Heat Wave for April 2024 indicates two spells of Heat Wave in April 2024: 5th to 7th April 2024 over eastern parts of India and Southeastern peninsula and 15th to 29th April 2024 over Odisha and West Bengal, Bihar, Jharkhand, Southeast peninsular India and interior parts of Karnataka.
- viii. Probabilistic Heat Wave forecast for May 2024 indicates above normal maximum temperatures likely over most parts of the Country.
- ix. Heat wave outlook for May 2024 is likely to be above normal by about 5-8 days over south Rajasthan, west Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, Marathwada and Gujarat region and 2-4 days over remaining parts of Rajasthan, east Madhya Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh and some parts of Chhattisgarh, interior Odisha, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Bihar, north interior Karnataka and Telangana and isolated pockets of north Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh.
- x. GIS based Heat Wave forecast bulletins are issued for Indian Railways covering the Railway lines and Railway stations.

Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC)

IG, Forests gave a presentation on prevention/ monitoring of forest fire:

- i. Based on the forest inventory records, in India, 54.40% of forests are exposed to occasional fires, 7.49% to moderately frequent fires and 2.40% vulnerable to high incidence levels. 35.71% of forests not exposed to fires of any real significance.
- ii. Satellite based Forest Fire alert control services such as Pre-Fire alert on Forest Fire danger rating system, near real-time Forest Fire monitoring and large Forest Fire monitoring system are in place to closely monitor Forest Fires.
- iii. Information on Forest Fire can be visualized from FSI Van-Agni Geo portal.
- iv. Forest fire prone areas are identified using historical data available with MoEF&CC.
- v. Web Feature Service (WFS) and Web Map Service (WMS) are also used to get information on Forest Fires.
- vi. Large Forest Fires (> 40 ha in extent) lasting more than 5 days are conveyed to the MHA DM control room.
- vii. Advisories are issued to the States on precautionary and convergence action to prevent Forest Fires.
- viii. Convergence action in coordination with NDMA is taken for Forest Fires lasting more than 48 hrs.
- ix. Special Communications are issued when the Forest Fires lasts for more

than 5 days. Close monitoring and field co-ordination by the Regional Offices of the MoEF&CC.

- x. Action Taken Reports on Forest Fires are received from the States/UTs, analysed and suitable advisories are issued to the States/UTs.
- xi. As per the data analysis, it has been observed that March and April have large number of Near-real time Forest Fire detections.

Ministry of Information and Broadcasting

Secretary, I&B, mentioned that:

- i. Guidelines and advisories on Heat Wave are regularly disseminated through Doordarshan, All India Radio and other mediums in coordination with NDMA and MoH&FW.
- ii. Live shows, Discussions, bytes from experts and doctors on Heat Wave are tele-cast to ensure maximum reach amongst the people.

3. Representatives from Odisha, West Bengal, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh briefed about the preparedness measures undertaken by the various departments of the respective States to counter the Heat Wave situation, hospital fire audits and forest fire.

4. After various discussion and deliberations, Union Home Secretary, MHA advised all the States and UTs as under:

- I. Heat wave conditions should be monitored at the highest level; and they should act on IMD forecasts.
- II. They should take all preparedness as per heatwave action plan and advisories issued by Central Ministries/ agencies and NDMA.
- III. All the assistance to prepare for Heat Wave conditions will be extended from all the line Ministries of Government of India.
- IV. Heat Wave forecasts are dynamic, and the heat wave periods are going to be longer this year and hence, the States/UTs should closely follow-up and monitor the Advisories and Bulletins released by IMD and NDMA.
- V. The States/UTs which have not updated the Heat Action Plan should immediately take steps to update it in coordination with NDMA and Regional Meteorological Centres.
- VI. IMD should continue to issue Forecast & Warnings on heat wave as per the protocol.
- VII. States/UTs should follow-up on the pending Fire safety audits of the Hospitals in coordination with MoH&FW on priority.
- VIII. Regular mock drills should be conducted for dealing with Forest Fires, with a special focus on major forest fires.
- IX. MoEF& CC in coordination with NDMA to sensitize all State/UTs to identify major forest fires and act to douse it as early as possible. Alert on major forest fires should be shared with SDMAs and integrated with CAP (Common

Alerting Protocol) of NDMA.

5) The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
